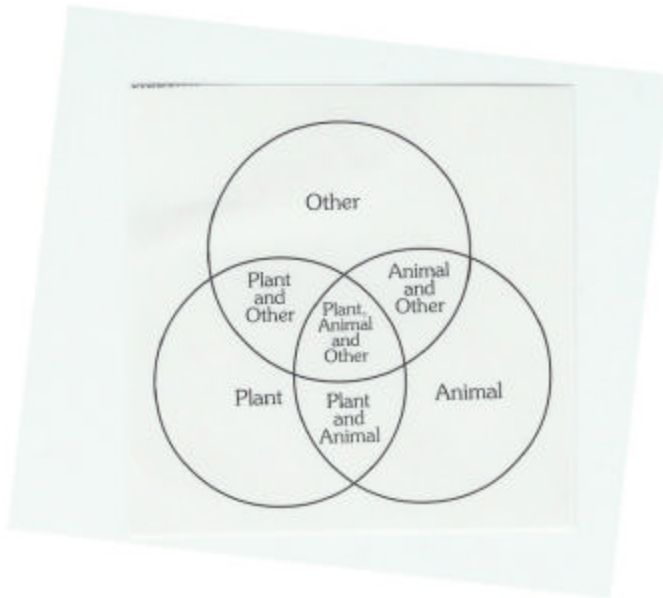
Which statement below does NOT apply to both plant and animal food sources?

Which of the following foods from their lunch would fit best in the “other” category?

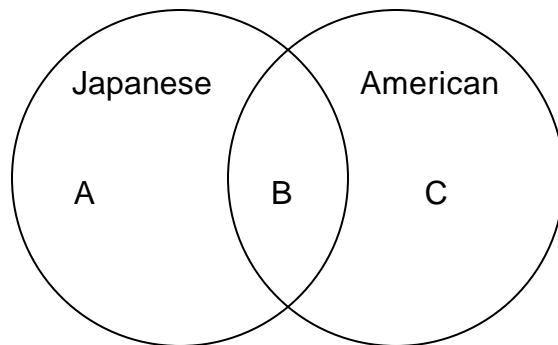
- A. Chicken
